Himalayan University hosts 7th Convocation

May 28, 2025: Himalayan University marked a momentous occasion with its 7th Convocation Ceremony, celebrating the academic achievements of 930 graduating and post-graduating students and conferring honorary doctorates upon distinguished national personalities.



The event was presided over by Chancellor P. Subba Rao, who praised the perseverance of the graduates and the university's academic community. Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Prakash Divakaran presented the Annual Report, highlighting Himalayan University's academic initiatives, infrastructure expansion, and future goals. Chief Guest Pasang Dorjee Sona, Minister for Education, Tourism, Rural Works, Parliamentary Affairs & Libraries, delivered an inspiring address emphasising the transformational

power of education in state and national development. He commended the university's role in uplifting youth and fostering leadership in the region. The ceremony was graced by the presence of Adv. Hemant Goel, Chairman of the University, Shri. Vijay Tripathi, Registrar, and Joint Registrar Shri. Dilip Jain. Spiritual guidance was shared by Swami Vedasarananda Maharaj ji, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Hospital, Itanagar, as the Guest of Honour. Two special guests, Nangbia Tapin, Registrar of Arunachal Pradesh Pharmacy Council, and Mrs. Lokam Sikap, Registrar-cum-Secretary of Arunachal Pradesh Nursing Council, were also in attendance.

Integrating Indian Knowledge System in Higher Education

April 16, 2025: The Department of Education and the Department of History collaboratively organised a Two-Day international conference on "NEP 2020: Integrating Indian Knowledge System in Higher Education' on 15th and 16th of April, 2025. Indigenous knowledge is a common learning approach that was prevalent before British colonial rule. Teaching the local language, history, and basic culture of indigenous peoples, as well as their knowledge, customs, and practices, is known as indigenous education. For implementing indigenous knowledge through IKS in the contemporary higher education system and holistic development of the students, the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 of India has emerged as a watershed moment in the history of Indian education.





The National Conference on "NEP 2020: Integrating Indian Knowledge System in Higher Education" was organised to create a more inclusive, culturally aware, and socially responsible education system to integrate traditional knowledge-led community services into contemporary educational practices in higher education.





Travelling to the Past

May 3, 2025: The Department of History, Himalayan University, Itanagar, organised an educational field study to the Malinithan archaeological site in Likabali on 3rd May 2025. This visit aimed to provide students with a firsthand experience of medieval temple architecture, religious syncretism, and the cultural heritage of Arunachal Pradesh, and to ignite their curiosity and admiration for historical and archaeological sites. The students of the Master of Arts in History, IV Semester, along with Mr Dope Ori and Mrs Kime Ana Lingu, faculty members from the Department of History, visited the archaeological site. Students were briefed by Mr. Buru Research Department Technical Taki. Assistant (Archaeology), who is taking care of the temple and the adjacent heritage museum and the archaeological site, on the structural and heritage aspects of the Malinithan temple. The educational tour to Malinithan and the archaeological site in Likabali offered students a range of valuable academic benefits. Students were exposed to the religious and artistic significance of the Malinithan temple, believed to be associated with the legend of Lord Krishna and Rukmini. The experience nurtured a sense of pride in their heritage, broadened students' horizons. and encouraged responsible tourism and cultural respect.

The Celebration of Indigenous Culture

May 7, 2025: The Department of History, Himalayan University in collaboration with the Department of Sociology organised an Inter-Departmental Cultural Fest with the theme "The Celebration of Indigenous Culture: A celebration of culture and heritage through art and display," where every pattern has a story untold and every cuisine traces the history through ages on May 7, 2025. The event was honoured by the presence of Mr. Vijay Tripathi, Registrar, Himalayan University, Dr. Raja Hussain, Dean, Academic Affairs, and Dr. Feroz Ahmad. Head, Department of Zoology, as special invitees, along with heads, faculty, and students of other departments. Students Explore Realities of Women Daily Wage Workers in Itanagar

April 16, 2025: In a meaningful blend of classroom theory and real-world engagement, Sociology students conducted a one-day field study focused on the experiences of women daily wage workers in Itanagar's Ganga market and adjoining areas. The study was part of a practical curriculum module titled "Assessing Job Satisfaction and Working Environment of Women Daily Wage Workers in Itanagar." It aimed to expose students to the layered challenges faced by women engaged in informal labour, an often-overlooked segment of the workforce. The study highlighted key concerns such as wage inequality, job insecurity, occupational health risks, and lack of social protection.



Access to Justice for All

May 13, 2025: In a bid to promote legal literacy and empower rural communities, the Department of Law, Himalayan University, organised a one-day Legal Awareness Camp on the theme "Access to Justice for All" at Phassang Village, Papum Pare district. The camp featured an interactive legal session by Inspector Neeraj Nishant, Officer-in-Charge of Chimpu Police Station. He addressed crucial topics such as FIR/Zero registration, arrest procedures, and the rising threat of cybercrime, urging everyone to be vigilant and informed. Adding depth to the programme, students delivered presentations on the POCSO Act and Domestic Violence, and performed thought-provoking skits on Drug Abuse of Arrested Persons. The creative and Rights performances were well-received by the community and served as powerful tools for social messaging.



Education and Environmental Preservation

May 19, 2025: The NSS Unit and Department of English at Himalayan University jointly organised a one-day literary event on the theme "Education and Environmental Preservation." The event served as a platform for students to creatively explore pressing environmental issues through the lens of literature.



Sehat aur Samaj: Youth for Health, Hope, and Harmony

The trip concluded with a field excursion focused on plant specimen collection, where students applied academic knowledge to real-world plant identification.



Camps and Tours











March 28, 2025: The Himalayan University, in collaboration with Ramakrishna Mission Hospital, Itanagar, organised a blood donation camp on the campus. As many as 50 donors donated blood. The camp was coordinated by the faculty of nursing and the school of pharmacy, under the supervision of Dr. Paruk Mugli.

April 12, 2025: The Department of Geography, Himalayan University, organised a one-day educational tour with the objective to provide students with practical exposure and a first-hand understanding of the socioeconomic conditions of Kiwi and paddy farmers. While classroom-based learning offers theoretical insights, this tour was aimed at bridging the gap between theory and practice by exposing students to real-life agricultural environments and rural livelihoods.



Practical Study Tours

April 12, 2025: The Department of Management visited Naara-Aaba Winery Ziro, where students are taken to visit factories to enhance practical learning through industrial exposure. The students interacted with the founding chairperson, Tage Rita Takhe and its sales executives.



May 10, 2025: The faculty of Life Sciences organised a program on 10th May 2025, focusing on environmental conservation and biodiversity documentation. The initiative aimed to engage students in practical conservation activities and enhance their understanding of local biodiversity and ecosystems. The program successfully combined fieldwork with academic learning, providing participants with valuable skills in biodiversity documentation and conservation practices. Such initiatives contribute to scientific knowledge and instil a sense of responsibility towards environmental stewardship among the youth.
